Pop Art

What is Pop Art?

Pop art is an art movement that started in the 1950s and was very popular in the 1960s in America and Britain. Pop art was normally related to everyday objects or people that were popular at the time. It made use of popular imagery, such as comics, films, advertising and household objects. It often used bright colours such as red, blue and yellow, as well as images of celebrities or fictional characters from TV or comics.

Who is Andy Warhol?

Andy Warhol was an American artist, director and producer who was a leading figure in the visual art movement known as pop art. He created simple, colourful artwork using everyday objects and imagery. He was born in 1928 in Pennsylvania. His pop art style is created by repeating the same picture several times and uses different colours every time.

Key Vocabulary

Spelling	Definition/Sentence
Line	Line is the beginning of all drawing. Line in an artwork can be used in many different ways. It can be used to create shape, pattern and form.
Shape	Shape can be shown in a number of ways. Sometimes we can recognise the shapes, at other times, they can look like something we haven't seen before. This could be called 'abstract'.
Colour	Colour is the visual element that has the strongest effect on our emotions. We use color to create the mood or atmosphere. For example, artwork that uses mainly reds and oranges, might make you feel angry.
Tone	Tone is the lightness or darkness of a color. Tone can be changed by using white or black to make a colour lighter or darker.
Form	Form is the physical shape of the artwork. Form generally links to sculpture work, 3D design and architecture but may also relate to the illusion of 3D image on a 2D surface.

Art Process

1. TAKE A SELFIE AND PRINT IT OUT SIX TIMES IN BLACK AND WHITE

2. ON EACH SELFIE USE JUST TWO COLOURING PENCILS TO COLOUR IN YOUR HAIR, FACE AND EYES

3. ONCE EACH SELFIE IS COLOURED IN, CUT IT OUT AND THEN STICK THEM ON A SHEET OF PAPER SIDE BY SIDE
