In DT, Rubies will be looking at how the Ancient Egyptians moved large stones using pulleys and levers. We will have a go ant designing and making our own pulley/lever system.

Our exploring will take us to the Equator, North and South hemisphere, reading co-ordinates by looking at longitude and latitude, time zones and comparing different climates around the World. We will also look at the importance of water and the River Nile to the Egyptians. Word Mechanics and Super Skills Children will be developing their spelling strategies by learning a new spelling rule each week such as the /l/ sound spelt y elsewhere than at the end of words. Additionally they will learn about word classes, grammar and punctuation to apply to their own writing. For example: conjunctions, prepositions, apostrophes and fronted adverbials. Each week children will read within a small group, with the teacher, interpreting and making inferences about a variety of texts. Each session will have a different focus allowing pupils to comment on the writer's use of language and use strategies to predict, interpret and summarise. Our Guided reading texts will be narratives and non-fiction texts related to the Egyptians topic. The children will complete activities based on their reading. The main focus for this session is reading comprehension. Other activities may include writing character descriptions, diary entries or poetry.

Rubies will be starting the Summer term by looking at descriptive poetry. Having listened and responded to poems, we will aim to learn some performance poetry and write descriptive poetry ourselves. Our non-fiction writing will be to write a report on out trip to the Dorchester Museum. After the half term break, will are going to write an adventure story. Working on including fronted adverbials and sentence openers. We will end the summer term by writing an instruction text about mummification.	At the start of every maths session, the children will continue to do their quick maths activities and work on moving through their maths passports. This term Rubies will be learning about length and perimeter, shapes, and statistics. Rubies will also be learning about time and converting time between seconds and minutes, days and months. As well as this we will be looking at time duration in real life situations. They will also be doing weekly arithmetic sessions. This will help them put their learning into practice. Please continue to support your children with their multiplication tables and telling the time.	 We will finish Living Things and their habitats by recognising that environments can change and that this can sometimes pose dangers to living things.
